This is when I got angry and said "oh no"...you will not get me...."Bring it!" and I was determined to kick some cancer butt Prior to that day in November 2008, I was caregiver to my husband as he battled throat cancer in 1998 and then we fought his lung cancer in 1999. Caregiving is the toughest job around as you have to watch your loved one in such discomfort and just "be there" for whatever they may need and support them with all your love and strength. I also was caregiver to my mom when she was diagnosed in March 2008 with breast cancer and I had to watch my fiesty petite mamma alienate herself from all of her family and friends because she was embarrassed that she had cancer. I have continued to watch her decline in health and spirit over these last eight years and it is heartbreaking. I am visiting with my parents in South Carolina right now as I write this with tears streaming down my face.

Why do I dragon boat? Why is ALL HANDS ABREAST a survivor, caregiver, supporter and friends team? I live each day to the fullest to prove there is LIFE AFTER CANCER, and I paddle as my "in your face" cancer! Cancer doesn't get to decide...I decide. I paddle to raise awareness and possibly make that one person realize..hey, maybe I should have the doctor take a look since I haven't been feeling well....We paddle together on our boat as we live our lives....together we are there to support each other and together we are there to

comfort each other. As a survivor, I cannot do this alone... I must have my caregivers, my supports, and my friends......Just as it is on
