Roberts puts double whammy on TCU

■ UH pitcher shuts down Frogs, drives in go-ahead run in 8th inning

FORT WORTH — Kevin Roberts held TCU to one run in seven innings and knocked in the tiebreaking run in the top of the eighth inning to lift the University of Houston past TCU 6-1 in the finale of a Conference USA series at Lupton Stadium.

With the victory, the Cougars (10-10, 19-24) kept the Horned Frogs (31-14, 15-6) from moving into a first-place tie with Tulane.

Roberts (5-3) struck out seven and scattered seven hits. He finished the day 1-for-5 with a run, RBI and double, but it would be a timely hit, knocking in Brad Lincoln from second base in the eighth inning.

The Cougars added an insurance run later in that inning and broke the game open with three runs in the top of the ninth inning, courtesy of Travis Tully's RBI double and a two-run homer from Lincoln (3-for-5, two runs and three RBIs).

Justin Vaclavik picked up his seventh save of the season after pitching a perfect 1 1/3 innings of relief.

It's the first time TCU has

been held to two runs since losing 2-1 to Rice on March 13.

In other games

■ **Baylor 8, Texas Tech 5** — The teams combined for seven homers as Seth Fortenberry hit two to lead the No. 11 Bears past the visiting Red Raiders.

Fortenberry hit a solo home run in the second inning before his two-run homer in the fifth, his first home runs of the season. Kevin Russo added a three-run homer and Michael Griffin had the last one for Baylor, hitting a solo home run in the eighth.

The victory keeps Baylor (30-17, 15-6 Big 12) in first place in the Big 12 standings.

Chris Williams homered in the sixth for Texas Tech and Cameron Blair and Brian Capps each hit solo home runs in the ninth for the Red Raiders (18-6, 8-11) before Michael Smith popped up to end the game.

Abe Woody (5-3) needed only 1 1/3 innings in relief of starter Cory Van Allen to earn the victory.

Texas Tech's Adam Lawford (2-6) lasted just two innings, giving up five runs on six hits.

■ **Texas A&M 3, Oklahoma State 1** — Chance Corgan lasted six innings, and three pitchers combined to hold the Cowboys hitless over the last three innings in a home victory.

Corgan (4-2) allowed one run on five hits before he was relieved in the seventh by Jordan Chambless.

Chambless and Jason Meyer each recorded one out before Kevin Whelan pitched the last 2 1/3 innings.

Coby Mavroulis brought home Ryan Hill for the go-ahead run in the sixth with an RBI single. Brandon Glover added two RBIs for Texas A&M (28-20-1, 8-13 Big 12).

Scott Richmond (3-4) threw the third complete game of the series for Oklahoma State (30-18, 10-11). He allowed three runs on 10 hits.

■ **Texas 6, Missouri 1** — Randy Boone threw eight innings, giving up just one run on four hits to lead the No. 1 Longhorns past the Tigers in Austin.

Boone (5-3), who struck out six and walked two, had pitched a shutout until Trevor Helms' RBI single in the eighth gave Missouri (31-13, 11-7 Big 12) its only run.

Chance Wheelless hit a solo home run for Texas (37-9, 13-7). ■ **Lamar 9, Sam Houston State 2**

— Junior Colt Crawford went 2-for-4 and hit a grand slam that broke a 1-1 tie as the Cardinals pounded out 15 hits en route to a win over the Bearkats in Southland action at Holleman Field in Huntsville.

Lamar (31-19, 12-9) avoided the sweep and will take a 12-day break for final exams before returning to action May 13 to begin a three-game series at Texas-San Antonio.

With the score tied at 1, the Cardinals grabbed the lead for good in the top of the fourth. Adrian Cantu and C.J. Ebarb singled to left field to lead off the inning and Sam Huff drew a one-out walk to load the bases.

Crawford followed with a grand slam down the line in left field, his second homer of the season, to put Lamar up 5-1.

■ **Texas State 11, Southeastern Louisiana 2** — Dominic Ramos and Kyle Jones combined for seven hits and seven runs as the visiting Bobcats beat the Lions to take two of three in the Southland series.

Texas State (30-18, 13-8 SLC) notched at least one run in the first five innings, and Bobby Sawicki allowed only two runs in eight innings. It was the Bobcats' third straight Southland series victory.

Texas State opened the scoring in the first inning when Jones' one-out RBI single scored Ramos from third.

Baylor takes Big 12 tennis crown

■ Texas narrowly captures women's championship

AUSTIN — Baylor continued its unbeaten tennis season Sunday with a 4-1 victory over Oklahoma State that gave the Bears their fourth straight Big 12 men's championship.

Baylor has won 50 straight matches dating to last season, when it won the national championship.

Benjamin Becker beat Oklahoma State's Boris Kuharic 6-2, 4-6, 6-3 to clinch the title for the Bears.

On the women's side, Texas' Katie Ruckert rallied to beat Baylor's Daniela Covello 5-7, 6-4, 6-1 in the final singles match, giving the Longhorns the Big 12 women's championship with a 4-3 win over the Lady Bears.

It is the first Big 12 title for the Texas women since 2002, when the Longhorns won the last of six straight conference tournaments.

In other news

■ **OSU takes Big 12 golf title** — Oklahoma State won its first Big 12 Conference golf title since 2000 with a nine-stroke victory over Oklahoma at Whispering Pines Golf Club in Trinity. Missouri finished in third place.

Oklahoma's Anthony Kim took medalist honors with a six-shot victory over Oklahoma State's Alex Noren.

The Cowboys, who have won four Big 12 titles and 49 conference titles overall, led every round of the tournament and finished with a 4-over-par 868. Oklahoma shot 13 over, and Missouri was 21 over.

Kim, Noren and Oklahoma State's Zack Robinson were the only golfers to finish under par.

OU's Cochell steps down

NORMAN, OKLA. — Long-time Oklahoma baseball coach Larry Cochell resigned Sunday, five days after using a racial slur during off-camera interviews with ESPN.

Cochell submitted a letter of resignation to school president David Boren.

"A good and caring man has made a terrible mistake for which he must assume responsibility," Boren said in a statement.

ESPN said Friday that Cochell, who is white, used a slur after praising a freshman outfielder, who is black, during off-camera interviews before a telecast of the OU-Wichita State game Tuesday.

Cochell, who had been head coach since 1991, led the Sooners to the College World Series title in 1994.

Assistant Sunny Golloway was named interim coach.
